The meeting of Jharkhand Occupational Safety and Health (JOSH) Cell was convened on 21st of January at RCH Conference hall/RCH campus, Namkum, Ranchi. The meeting was presided over by Mr. Ashish Singhmar, Mission Director, National Health Mission, Dept. of Health & FW, GoJ; was conducted by Dr. Rakesh Dayal, STO, Jharkhand and attended by members of JOSH (List annexed)

The meeting started with welcome address by Dr Rakesh Dayal (State TB Officer). He welcomed all the participants and informed about the menace of Occupational Health Hazards (OHH) causing Pneumoconiosis especially Silica particles causing Silicosis and need of a comprehensive approach towards the issue. The members were informed about the actions taken by the nodal department for Silicosis i.e Labour department, the roles & responsibilities assigned to Health department in the state action plan prepared by the nodal department and activities carried out so far by the JOSH cell. Following were the key discussion points with suggestions and recommendations:

- All three medical colleges should be made nodal centers for management of Silicosis & other allied occupational diseases. To achieve it, strengthening of diagnostic services is required for which budget should be incorporated in the PIP of 2015-16. If required, budget provisions may also be made through state budget to medical colleges. Budgeting is required for equipments like one high resolution X-ray (300 mA), two Spirometers & other related logistics in each medical college hospital. A report from medical colleges should be sought regarding availability of such equipments.
- The cases suspected by MO at PHC, CHC, Referral & Sub-divisional Hospitals should be referred to respective District Hospital for further evaluation (as all civil surgeons have already been designated as notifying surgeon by the Labour department) where after necessary investigations & provisional diagnosis as case of Silicosis, treatment should be started and then should be referred to nearest medical college hospital for further evaluation and necessary actions. Medical College Hospital, if necessary, should refer the case to nearest Regional Institute of Occupational Health (RIOH) for further confirmation. At the same time such case should be reported to nearest ESI Hospital.
- Record of such cases should be maintained at district level and sent to JOSH Cell on monthly basis (by 5th of every month) and to the Labour department on quarterly basis with a copy to JOSH cell (by 7th of month following end of quarter).
- District TB Officer (DTO) of each district shall assist Civil Surgeon office for maintenance & compilation of report. The higher centers also then need to send feedback to referring district.
- The members suggested a simple format for reporting & feedback (two sets of forms) which should be sent to all districts and medical colleges. (Format annexed)

- All such cases should be screened for pulmonary TB by doing Sputum smear microscopy for AFB (to rule out TB or co-existent TB).
- Proper counseling of such cases should be done at all levels.
- List of ESI Hospitals in the state should be sought from ESI directorate/Labour department and should be provided to all members of JOSH cell and all districts.
- A report regarding the availability of investigatory facilities for Silicosis available in the district & referral hospitals should be sought from all districts.
- Frequent sensitization of CSs and DTOs at state level and MOs at district level should be carried out.
- Involvement of industries/companies under CSR for IEC and screening in camp mode with the help of Labour department & Industries department.
- IEC cell to be requested to develop prototype of IEC materials (having information about hazards, warning signs, preventive measures etc.). The developed IEC material should be displayed at health facilities. Also the prototype should be provided to Labour & Industries department for display at all factories /mines/industries/companies.
- Suggested mandatory post mortem examinations of silicosis victims require legal opinion or opinion from ESI directorate.
- Possibilities of including the victims under RSBY/BPL scheme should be explored.
- Director, Medical Education should also be included in the JOSH Cell.

The meeting ended with a vote of thanks by Dr Rakesh Dayal. He thanked all the participants for their valuable time and suggestions.
